**SIZE:** One Size

**Hat:** Finished circumference about 19 in. (48.5 cm)

**Scarf:** About 6 x 50 in. (15 x 127 cm)

**MATERIALS**

- [135-203 Lion Brand Hometown USATM Yarn: Mardi Gras](#)  
3 Balls
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size P-15](#)
- [Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**GAUGE:**

6 1/2 sts + 5 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

**HAT**

Ch 33.

**Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, \*sc in next ch, dc in next ch; rep from \* across, ending with a dc in last ch - 32 sts at the end of this row.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, \*sc in next dc, dc in next sc; rep from \* across.

Rep Row 2 until the piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beg.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through sts of last row and pull gently to gather sts. Use remaining tail to sew seam.

**SCARF**

Ch 11.

**Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, \*sc in next ch, dc in next ch; rep from \* across - 10 sts.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, \*sc in next dc, dc in next sc; rep from \* across.

Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 50 in. (127 cm) from beg.

Fasten off.

**FINISHING**

Weave in ends.
