Lacy Eyelets Afghan
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SKILL LEVEL: Easy + (Level 3)

SIZE: One Size

About 44 x 60 in. (112 x 152.5 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Feb 24, 2014)

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, *ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp; rep from * to turning ch-sp, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 17 sc and 16 ch-3 sps.

MATERIALS

7 Balls
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size P-15 \(10 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Wool-Ease® Thick & Quick® (Article #640).
Solids, Heathers, Twists: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool
Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon
Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon
Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)
Prints (Sequoia, Mesquite, Granite): 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)
Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)*



GAUGE:

2 (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) groups and 4 rows = about 5 in. (12.5 cm).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.



AFGHAN

Ch 66.

Row 1: (Sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in 2nd ch from hook, *sk next 3 ch, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch; rep from * to last 4 ch, ch 3, sk next 3 ch, sc in last ch - 16 (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) groups.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in first sc, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in each ch-3 sp across to last ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-3 sp.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, *ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp; rep from * across - 17 sc and 16 ch-3 sps.

Row 5: Ch 5 (counts as dc, ch 2), sc in 2nd ch of next ch-3 sp, *ch 5, sc in 2nd ch of next ch-3 sp; rep from * across, ch 2, dc in last sc - 2 dc, 16 sc, and 17 ch-sps.

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, *ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp; rep from * to turning ch-sp, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch - 17 sc and 16 ch-3 sps.

Row 7: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in first sc, *sk next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next sc; rep from * to last ch-3 sp, sk last ch-3 sp, sc in last sc - 16 (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) groups.

Rows 8-43: Rep Rows 2-7 six more times.

Rows 44 and 45: Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Do not fasten off.

Border

Rnd 1: Do not turn, *ch 4, sc in edge of Afghan; rep from * evenly spaced all the way around the outside edge of Afghan; join with sl st in base of first ch-4. **Note:** Working about 4 ch-4 sps over 6 rows of pattern across each long edge will help sp the sts evenly across the side edges.

Rnd 2: (Sl st, ch 1, sc) in first ch-4 sp, *ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp; rep from * around, ch 5; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 3: Sl st in first 2 ch of first ch-5 sp, sc in 3rd ch of first ch-5 sp, *ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp; rep from * around, ch 3; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
