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# Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

## Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> LB Collection<sup>®</sup> Silk Mohair Purple Passion Crochet Wrap

**SKILL LEVEL:** Intermediate (Level 3)

**SIZE:** One Size

16 in./40.5 cm wide by 60 in./152.5 cm long

### **MATERIALS**

- 484-147 Lion Brand LB Collection Silk Mohair Yarn: Iris 6 Balls *\*LB Collection Silk Mohair (Article #484). 70% Super Kid Mohair, 30% Silk; package size: 0.88oz/25.00 gr. (231yds/212m) pull skeins*
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6 (4 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



### **GAUGE:**

2 shells and one pineapple at widest point = 8 in./20.5 cm; Rows 1–8 = 4 in./10 cm

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

### **STITCH EXPLANATION:**

**Beg-sh (Beginning shell):** (Sl st, ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated space.

**Fsc (Foundation single crochet):** This technique creates a foundation chain and a row of single crochet stitches in one.

Step 1: Place a slip knot on hook, ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop; yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"); yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (the "single crochet").

Step 2: Insert hook into the "chain" of the previous stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"), yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (the "single crochet").

Repeat for the length of foundation.

**Sh (Shell):** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated space or stitch.

## Wrap

**Foundation Row:** Work 209 Fsc.

**Row 1:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in first st, [ch 3, sk next 3 sts, sh in next st] twice, \*[ch 3, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st] 7 times, [ch 3, sk next 3 sts, sh in next st] 3 times; repeat from \* across-5 pattern repeats.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp] twice, \*ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 6 times, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp] twice; repeat from \* across.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp] twice, \*ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 5 times, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp] twice; repeat from \* across.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, 10 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 4 times, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, 10 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 9 times, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 3 times, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 9 times, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, [sc in next dc, ch 3] 10 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, [sc in next dc, ch 3] 10 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 9 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 9 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 8:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 8 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 8 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 7 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 7 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 6 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 6 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 11:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 5 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 5 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 12:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 4 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 4 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 4 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 13:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 3 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 5 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 3 times, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 14:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] twice, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 6 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] twice, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Row 15:** Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next st, beg-sh in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sh in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 7 times, sh in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sh in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across.

**Rows 16–28:** Repeat Rows 2–14.

## Finishing

With a yarn needle, weave in ends. Immerse the piece in cool water, then squeeze out the excess water, taking care not to wring or twist. Place the piece on a towel on a flat surface and gently stretch to open up the lace pattern. Leave until completely dry.
