# Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

## Lion Brand® Homespun® Ripple Scarf

Pattern Number: 60306AD

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy +

**SIZE:** One Size  
About 6 x 50 in. (15 x 127 cm)

### MATERIALS

- 790-396 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Fiesta  
1 Ball
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size N-13
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

### GAUGE:

10 1/2 sts + 4 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**dec 2 over 5 (decrease 2 sts over 5 sts)** Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop. Yarn over and draw through 2 loops (2 loops remain on hook), sk next 3 sts, yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop. Yarn over, draw through 2 loops, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook — 2 sts decreased.

### NOTES:

When skipping sts, count each dc and each ch as one st.

### SCARF

Ch 134.

**Row 1:** Dc in 6th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as dc, ch 1), \*(ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch) 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch, (ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch) 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch, dec 2 over 5; rep from \* to last 8 ch, (ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch) 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch, (dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch.

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, (dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, (dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp) 3 times, \*dec 2 over 5, (dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc) 3 times, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp) 3 times; rep from \* across to last 2 ch-sps (one of these ch-sps is formed by the turning ch), dec 2 over 5.

**Row 3:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, sk next dc, dc in next dc, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) 3 times, \*ch 1, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, (dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc) 3 times, dec 2 over 5, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) 3 times; rep from \* to last ch-3 sp, ch 1, dc in ch-3 sp, ch 1, dc in top of turning ch.

**Rows 4 and 5:** Rep Rows 2 and 3.

**Row 6:** Rep Row 2. Fasten off.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends.
