## **Giant Donut Floor Pouf**

It's no secret: I LOVE DONUTS. My classic favorite is a glazed twist, but I'm also crazy for donuts covered in breakfast cereal, donuts stuffed with custard, and donuts decorated like cute animals! A few years ago, I crocheted some colorful animal donuts and wore them like little hats, but I've always wanted to design a giant donut floor pouf for my living room. I know my fellow donut lovers will also delight in having this super-sized treat to lounge on. Your guests will be fighting over who gets the sweetest seat!

## **Ingredients**

Super bulky weight

Lion Brand Hometown USA, 100% Acrylic, 5 oz (142 g)/81 yds (74 m) per skein:

- 5 skeins #135-102 Honolulu Pink (A),
- 7 skeins #135-159 Madison Mustard (B),
- 1 skein #135-099 Los Angeles Tan (C)

Per skein: small amounts each in assorted colors for sprinkles in Vanna's Choice:

- 1 skein #860-175 Radiant Lime
- 1 skein #860-157 Radiant Yellow
- 1 skein #860-106 Aquamarine
- 1 skein #860-113 Scarlet
- 1 skein #860-134 Terracotta
- 1 skein #860-100 White

## **Tools**

- M/13 (9.00 mm) crochet hook
- H/8 (5.00 mm) crochet hook
- tapestry needle
- stitch marker
- four 32 oz (900 g) bags polyester stuffing

## **Gauge**

9 sts x 11 rows in sc with larger hook = 4" (10 cm). Take time to check gauge.

Finished Size

26" (6 cm) diameter x 15" (38 cm) high

## **Notes:**

- 1) If you've never crocheted a donut shape before, it is recommended to do a trial run through the pattern with regular worsted weight yarn and an H hook.
- 2) Donut is worked from the inner hole to the outer edge, and then back to the hole.
- 3) RS shows on outside of donut.

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## **Directions**

### **Donut**

With A and larger hook, ch 54. Join with sl st to 1st ch to form ring, being careful not to twist ch. Place marker for beg of rnd.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch around—54 sc. Do not join, rather work in a continuous spiral.

Rnds 2–15: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 16: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 5 sc] 9 times—63 sc. Rnd 17: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 6 sc] 9 times—72 sc. Rnd 18: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 7 sc] 9 times—81 sc. Rnd 19: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 8 sc] 9 times—90 sc. Rnd 20: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 9 sc] 9 times—99 sc. Rnd 21: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 10 sc] 9 times—108 sc. Rnd 22: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 11 sc] 9 times—117 sc. Rnd 23: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 12 sc] 9 times—126 sc. Rnd 24: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 13 sc] 9 times—135 sc. Rnd 25: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 14 sc] 9 times—144 sc. Rnd 26: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 15 sc] 9 times—153 sc. Rnd 27: [(2 sc) in next sc, sc in next 16 sc] 9 times—162 sc. Rnds 28–33: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 34: Sc in each sc around, join with sl st in next st.

Rnd 35: Working in FLO, sl st in each st around, keeping sts loose and even, join with sl st in 1st sl st.

Fasten off A. Join B.

Rnd 36: Working in BLO, sc in each st in rnd 34. Do not join. (Photo 1).



Rnds 37–41: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 42: Sc in each sc around, join with sl st in next st. Fasten off B. Join C.

Rnds 43–44: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 45: Sc in each sc around, join with sl st in next st. Fasten off C. Join B.

Rnds 46–59: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 60: [invdec, sc in next 16 sc] 9 times—153 sc. Rnd 61: [invdec, sc in next 15 sc] 9 times—144 sc. Rnd 62: [invdec, sc in next 14 sc] 9 times—135 sc. Rnd 63: [invdec, sc in next 13 sc] 9 times—126 sc. Rnd 64: [invdec, sc in next 12 sc] 9 times—117 sc. Rnd 65: [invdec, sc in next 11 sc] 9 times—108 sc. Rnd 66: [invdec, sc in next 10 sc] 9 times—99 sc. Rnd 67: [invdec, sc in next 9 sc] 9 times—90 sc. Rnd 68: [invdec, sc in next 8 sc] 9 times—81 sc. Rnd 69: [invdec, sc in next 7 sc] 9 times—72 sc. Rnd 70: [invdec, sc in next 6 sc] 9 times—63 sc. Rnd 71: [invdec, sc in next 5 sc] 9 times—54 sc.

Rnds 72–90: Sc in each sc around, join with sl st in next st. Fasten off, leaving a tail 1 yd (1 m) long for sewing (Photo 2).



Weave in short end of foundation ch.

### **Sprinkles (make 22)**

With smaller hook and desired color, ch 3, join with sl st to 1st ch to form ring. Place marker for beg of rnd.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, work 8 sc in ring—8 sc. Do not join, rather work in a continuous spiral.

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around.

Rep rnd 2, stuffing lightly as you go, until piece is 3.5" (9 cm) long, join with sl st in next st. Fasten off, leaving a tail 24" (61 cm) long. Thread tail through 8 sts and pull to close. Weave in the short end.

### **Assembly**

Whipstitch the last rnd of donut to foundation ch, using 1 yd (1 m) of A at a time and stuffing donut as you go. (Photo 3).



Sew 10 sts at a time and be sure that stuffing is full and smooth before sewing further.

Sew sprinkles to donut as desired.
