SKILL LEVEL: Easy

SIZE: Varies, 24 months (2 yrs), Child 3

SIZES 12-18 months (2 years, 3 years)

Finished Chest 23 (24, 26) in. (58.5 (61, 66) cm)

Finished Length 12 (13, 14) in. (30.5 (33, 35.5) cm)

Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS


- 135-194 Lion Brand Hometown USATM Yarn: Monterey Lime
3 Balls
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 13 [9 mm]
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5
- Lion Brand Stitch Holders
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

GAUGE:

9 sts + 13 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

Kimono is worked in one piece starting at lower edge of back, worked over the shoulders and ending at lower edge of fronts.



KIMONO

Back

Cast on 26 (28, 30) sts. Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 7 (7 1/2, 8) in. (18 (19, 20.5) cm) from beg, end with a WS row.

Note: End with a WS row means that the last row you work should be a purl (WS) row.

Shape Sleeves

Cast on 7 (8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows – 40 (44, 48) sts for sleeves. Continue in St st until piece measures 11 1/2 (12 1/2, 13 1/2) in. (29 (32, 34.5) cm) from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Next Row (RS): K15 (16, 18) sts and slip to stitch holder for right front, join 2nd ball of yarn and bind off next 10 (12, 12) sts for back neck, k to end for left front.

Left Front

Working on 15 (16, 18) sts of left front only, work 5 more rows in St st.

Next Row (RS): K2, yo, knit to end – 16 (17, 19) sts.

Note: The yo (yarnover) has increased your st count by one st.

Next Row: Purl to 2 sts before end of row, yo, p2 – 17 (18, 20) sts.

Repeat last 2 rows until there are 33 (36, 39) sts on needle. Sleeve should measure about 10 (11, 12) in. (25.5 (28, 30.5) cm) from sleeve cast-on edge, end with a RS row.

Shape Sleeve

Next Row (WS): Bind off 7 (8, 9) sts, purl to end of row.

Continue even in St st (continue even means to work without increasing or decreasing) until piece measures 24 (26, 28) in. (61 (66, 71) cm) from beg, end with a WS row. Bind off all sts.

Right Front

Slip sts for right front from stitch holder back to needle. Starting with a WS row, work as for left front, reversing shaping.

Ties

Using crochet hook, join yarn on end of Right Front neck shaping and ch 10 in. (25.5 cm) for tie, fasten off. Join yarn at same place on the Left Front and ch 24 in. (61 cm) for tie. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Fold piece in half along shoulders. Sew side and sleeve seams, leaving 1/2 in. (1.5 cm) unsewn on right side seam 6 (6 1/2, 7) in. (15 (16.5, 18) cm) up from lower edge for tie opening. Weave in ends.
