# Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

## Lion Brand® Tweed Stripes

### Woodland Path Scarf

Pattern Number: L0478

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy

**SIZE:** One Size  
About 6 x 72 in. (15 x 183 cm)

**CORRECTIONS:** (applied Feb 8, 2011)

Rep Rows 10-29 until piece measures about 70 in. (178 cm) from beginning, end with a Row 29.

#### MATERIALS

- 753-206 Lion Brand Tweed Stripes Yarn: Woodlands  
2 Balls
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles - Size 10 [6 mm]
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

#### GAUGE:

14 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

##### **kfb (knit into front and then back)**

An increase worked as follows:

1. Knit the next st through the front loop, but do not remove the st from your left hand needle.
2. Knit the same st once more, this time inserting your needle through the back loop of the st. You will have created 2 loops (sts) on your right hand needle.
3. Drop the st from your left hand needle - 1 st increased.

#### SCARF

Cast on 2 sts.

**Row 1 (Increase Row):** K to last st, kfb - 3 sts at the end of this row.

**Rows 2-19:** Rep Increase Row 18 times - 21 sts at the end of Row 19.

**Row 20 (Decrease Row):** K to last 2 sts, k2tog - 20 sts at the end of this row.

**Rows 21-29:** Rep Decrease Row 9 times - 11 sts at the end of Row 29.

Rep Rows 10-29 until piece measures about 70 in. (178 cm) from beginning, end with a Row 29.

**Next 9 Rows:** Rep Decrease Row - 2 sts rem.

**Last Row:** K2tog - 1 st rem.

Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends.
